903 Visitors To School District Buildings and Facilities

I. Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to set guidelines and procedures governing visits to District schools, facilities and property.

II. General Statement of Policy

A. The School Board and staff of the Fridley Public Schools welcome parents, members of the community, full-time PSEO students and other interested persons to periodically visit the schools or attend school-sponsored events. The Fridley School Board recognizes the many benefits of partnerships and successful relationships with the community. Such partnerships help students to succeed in their learning, and school visits are an appropriate vehicle to enhance partnerships with the community.

B. The School Board recognizes that reasonable restrictions must be placed on visits to District facilities in order to maintain an environment that is safe and conducive to learning and working.

III. Post-Secondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) Students

A. A student enrolled in a post-secondary enrollment options course may remain at the school site during regular school hours in accordance with established procedures.

B. A student enrolled in a post-secondary enrollment options course may be provided with reasonable access, during regular school hours, to a computer and other technology resources that the student needs to complete coursework for a post-secondary enrollment course in accordance with established procedures.

IV. Visitor Limitations

A. An individual, post-secondary enrollment option student, or group may be denied permission to visit a school or school property or such permission may be revoked if the visitor(s) does not comply with the school district procedures and regulations or if the visit is not in the best interest of students, staff or the district.

B. An individual, post-secondary enrollment option student, or group who enters school property without complying with the required procedures may be guilty of criminal trespass and thus subject to criminal penalty. Such persons may be detained by the school principal or designee in a reasonable period of time pending the arrival of a police officer.
